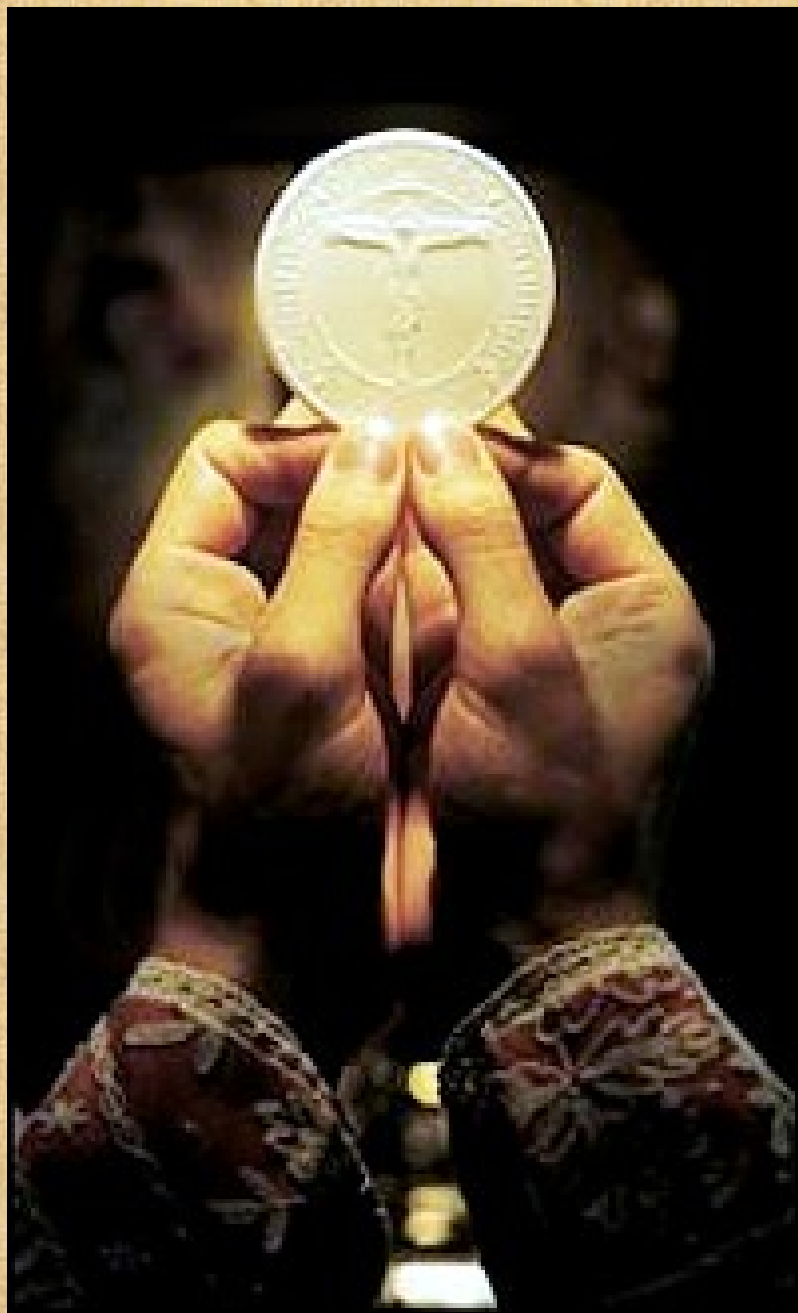

An English version of this text has now been completed: this is the first major revision of English Mass texts since 1973.

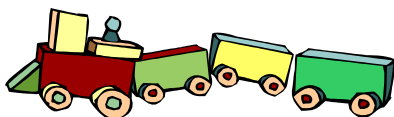
We envision our energetic community prepared to celebrate and worship together according to the new Missal — watch for details about some special programs and events in the Fall that will help us to prepare further.

A Message from the Director:



This week is the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. For me, this feast is about **being** the Body of Christ—being his hands, arms, feet, and most importantly, his heart in the world.

The following report, from one of those active in the Faith in Acton ministry, demonstrates one way of **being** the Body of Christ in the world.

Last fall, over 8 Monday nights, I was in a small group that studied the plight of migrants in a class called, "Crossing Borders: Migration, Theology, and the Human Journey." We learned the Church's official position, read a couple of good books, and watched a stack of good videos. I expected to learn a lot – and I got more than I bargained for.

One of the videos showed a brief segment about teaching English classes to immigrants. We were intrigued when it mentioned that the instructors did not need special training, nor did they need to speak any language besides English. We decided to look into this for ourselves.

We had a few meetings to brainstorm about how we might turn ourselves into English teachers. The Casa supported our intentions, but couldn't offer migrant workers for us to teach. So, we looked to Saint Matthew's Parish as a destination for our outreach effort. They advertised the classes in their Sunday bulletin during January, and by February, we had a classroom full of eager students.

We didn't exactly know what we were doing, but we all knew that we could speak English, so we jumped in with both feet. We prepared each class in advance, and took the plunge every Friday night from 6PM until 7:30 PM. We used a team-teaching approach, which we all liked.



The results were beyond our wildest dreams. The students came back week after week. They studied at home, they paid attention in class, they worked hard and they made progress every week. They were grateful that we did this for them, and they thanked us profusely regularly. Our teacher-student relationships turned into friendships. To say that this was a rewarding endeavor would be a gross understatement.

I am going to go back in the fall and do this some more – and so are the other volunteers. On August 20, we are planning to hold a training session to teach any new volunteers what we learned. 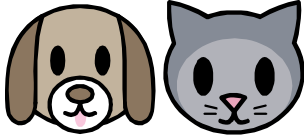

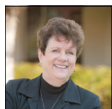

This is a "Want Ad" from God. If you and your spouse value a God-centered marriage and want to share that with couples who are preparing for marriage, this opportunity is for you both.

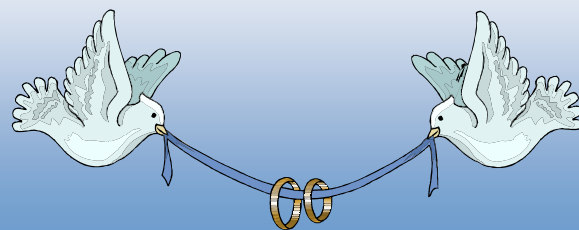
