PASTORAL REFLECTION



Dear Holy People of God, Number 7 is often considered a number of divine perfection and completeness in Judeo-Christian symbolism. In the context of creation, God completed His work in seven days, underscoring the idea of wholeness

and perfection. It's also associated with rest, as God rested on the seventh day after creating the world. Throughout the Bible, the number 7 appears frequently, representing spiritual fullness and divine order.

In the verse, when Jesus tells Peter to forgive not just seven times but seventy-seven times, He is emphasizing a message of boundless mercy and compassion. By using the number 77, Jesus is extending the idea of divine completeness in forgiveness. He's teaching that forgiveness should not be limited by a specific number; rather, it should be granted without measure, just as God's forgiveness knows no bounds.

This teaching goes beyond a mere numerical value and delves into the depth of the human heart and its capacity to forgive. It challenges us to move beyond our natural inclination to hold grudges or set limits on our forgiveness. Of course, it is not easy.

In essence, the verse with the number 7 encourages us to embrace forgiveness as an act of divine love, underscoring the transformative power of compassion and reconciliation. It serves as a reminder that forgiveness not only heals relationships but also nourishes the soul and draws us closer to the divine example of perfect love and mercy.

May the Lord help us and transform us,

Infant Baptisms

Once upon a time, it was common to baptize infants during a Liturgy of the Word on a Sunday afternoon apart from the regular Sunday eucharistic liturgy. Perhaps only the priest and a few family members with the godparents were present. One had the sense this was a private, family celebration. Today, we celebrate infant Baptisms within the Sunday eucharistic liturgy because we recognize that sacraments are communal events — celebrations of and by the Church and take place within the community of the Church. The sacrament of Baptism changes the status of the one being baptized — one emerges from the font born into a relationship with the Church and with God.

Celebrating Baptism during Sunday eucharistic liturgies heightens the rich theology of the Rite of Baptism. The baby is being *incorporated* (from the Latin *corpus*, meaning "body") into the body of Christ, the Church. Sunday Eucharist is the primary event that the Church community gathers. So, in the Rite of Baptism, it's not just the parents and godparents that have responsibility for the new member of the Church. All members have "an important part to play in the baptism of the child" (Rite of Baptism of Children, 4). The "faith in which the children are baptized is not the private possession of the individual family, but the common treasure of the whole Church of Christ" (#4).

The community is present to help, support, pray, and nurture the faith of the child as he or she grows in communion with Jesus Christ and the Church itself. Parents and godparents hopefully have a sense that this child will be nurtured and supported in the faith as he or she grows in the life of Christ.

In two weeks we will celebrate the Feast of Saint Francis.

As we have come to know, Saint Francis of Assisi was a man with keen vision, exquisite



sensitivity, a great heart, and a deep conviction of eternal values. Certainly he was someone deserving of a great celebration of his gift to the world. Please come and join with the friars and the Casa community to celebrate his life and inspiration!

"Transitus"

The memorial of the passing of St. Francis Celebrated on Tuesday, October 3, 2023 at 7 pm

Each year, lovers of St. Francis from all over the world solemnly gather to commemorate a touching event in his remarkable life. It is called the *TRANSITUS* — that is, his passage from earthly life to everlasting life. Francis died on the evening of October 3, just as the brothers were singing.

The Transitus uniquely celebrates our Franciscan identity by rooting ourselves ritually both in sacred Scripture and the historical foundations of the brotherhood. Saint Francis is rumored to have had a "sweet tooth" ... Lady Jacoba used to bake almond cookies as a gift for him. In fact, she brought them to him the night he died. To celebrate that sweet memory, each year we have a dessert potluck by the poolside after the Transitus service. All are invited to bring something sweet to share!


