PASTORAL REFLECTION



Walking out of Church today, are you inspired by the second reading (Paul's letter to Philemon, a leader in the Colossian church) asking that the "good you do be voluntary and not something forced."

(Philem. 1:14) Is your heart open to the message "I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works." (James2:18) These are challenging words. The challenge lies in the relationship between faith and works: a genuine, living faith will produce good works willingly. When we do good works, we honor God.

"Taizé Prayer Around the Cross" Every Wednesday at 7pm.

The service lasts about 35–40 minutes and consists of short chants repeated over and over and periods of silence which give it a meditative character. These short refrains express basic realities of faith, and gradually penetrate the whole being. All are welcome!



"Can we rest in our goodness as we look to the divine goodness of others? Can we abide in His love as we love the loveliness of others? God who is good, sees our goodness. God who is love, admires our loveliness. Long before we adored the Lord, God adored us. You're adorable. Yes, you are. But in the eyes of God, so is all of creation and all of humanity ... even the jerks. God peers into the depths of their hearts and adores them, too.

In our eucharistic renewal here and across our nation, I'm wondering if we can make a concerted effort to spend an equal amount of time adoring our God in each other as we do in our tabernacles.

So, be good ... and be at rest with that. Be love ... and abide in that. But, be good with others and be love for others ... even the jerks."

Gospel Reflection for Parents

A great way to drive home the point of this Sunday's gospel to your family would be to provide your children with a list of things that they are responsible for interspersed with things that they like to do—for example, make their beds, take out the garbage, go to the park, do homework, watch television, have a snack, feed the cat. The list should reflect their responsibilities and favorite recreations. Tell them to pretend that company is coming and ask which of the things listed should be done first. The teachable moment here is to explain that this is called setting priorities.

After listening to the gospel together, ask your kids what Jesus says is the most important thing for them to do. Jesus tells us that the number-one priority is to follow him. But just as it is not always easy to do the things we are supposed to do before doing the fun things, it is not always easy to be a follower of Jesus. Yet when we put Jesus first, we will be truly happy.

We moved to Phoenix in July 2014 with our daughter Ellie, who was nine months old then and is now almost nine years old. After church shopping, we became members of The Casa a couple of years later. Jenn and I are musicians, so the music at The Casa was the main attraction. We met as undergrads playing liturgical music at Georgetown University and went on to play in or direct ensembles in El Sauz, TX, Syracuse, NY, Tucson, AZ, and Brownsville, TX. Parenthood has resulted in a hiatus from liturgical music--though Jenn has played violin for Taizé services at The Casa--but we can occasionally be seen around the Valley and state with our bluegrass band Of Kith & Kin. Beyond the music, we've always had strong connections to Franciscan and

Jesuit spirituality and a commitment to putting Catholic social teaching into practice, so The Casa felt like a natural home. Jenn and Ellie have been involved with ministry to the hungry and unhoused through St. Vincent de Paul, and I regularly volunteer with asylum seekers at the International Rescue Committee's Welcome Center, along with impersonating St. Francis at Family Catechesis events. If memory serves, we joined the Tau Society to get that fancy ceramic plaque. (Kidding - I think someone helpfully pointed out that we could divide our monthly contribution between the weekly collection and Tau to help sustain The Casa, which sounded like a win-win).
