PASTORAL REFLECTION



There are somewhere between 230 and 250 million Christians in the United States, and yet we live in a time more divisive than I have seen in my 50 years. As we are often reminded by media, whether on the television or the web, we live in an era of a very

strained social discourse. In almost every avenue of our lives, we can see a growing polarization that leaves people unwilling even to try to begin to understand those that don't think, feel, and act like themselves. I have often experienced that though we might know a thing, that thing may not play a part in our lives until something happens to remind us of its relevance.

For me, the responsorial psalm for this Sunday is one of those reminders.

It speaks of a person who; thinks the truth in the heart, slanders not with his tongue, harms not his fellow man, does not reproach their neighbor, one who accepts no bribe against the innocent.

All of these things we are called to do as Christians, and in doing so, we are told we will live in the presence of the Lord. How wonderful it is that we can do so little as not to be a jerk and gain so much. Although such a small thing, it seems that of late, fewer and fewer of the people of God have been listening to those things that we know we are called to as Christians. Let us together truly listen to and do what we are called to do as God's people; let us be what this Sunday's responsorial psalm calls us to be.

"Do not neglect hospitality, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels." (Hebrews13:2)

Gospel Reflection for Parents

What do you think about Martha's and Mary's role in today's Gospel? Sometimes when we hear the Gospel, we have difficulty getting around the social norms of Jesus' time. It seems like we cannot relate to this situation which can feel so foreign to us. One way we might consider this situation is

through the boundaries or social expectations placed on Martha and Mary, as well as our own today.

At the time of Jesus' visit, women cleaned, cooked, and served their guests, which is why Martha gets angry about Mary's behavior. Why is Mary acting outside of what is expected of her? Why is she sitting there listening to Jesus just like one of his followers? Women can't be disciples of Christ. Of course, Jesus breaks through this barrier for us. All of us can be followers of Christ!

Why does this matter for us today? Our society is very different than when Jesus was here. Yet, we still have boundaries and social norms we follow. Think beyond gender. What other ways are we "expected" to behave at work or school? With friends or family? How do these keep us from following Jesus at all times of our lives? Think about practical ways we can break through these boundaries and show that we, too, can be a follower of Jesus. — Cheryl Hentz, Youth & Young Adult Minister



Saint of the Week Saint Bonaventure Feast Day: July 15

The Seraphic Doctor Man of Good Fortune Contemporary of Aquinas

Christ has something in common with all creatures. With the stone he shares existence, with the plants he shares life, with the animals he shares sensation, and with the angels he shares intelligence. Thus all things are transformed in Christ since in the fullness of his nature he embraces some part of every creature.

Reflection:

There is a saying repeated in liturgy and in our Catholic daily lives that "God is love." What does that mean to you and in the work you do?

Background: Known as the "Seraphic Doctor" because of his his love for God and his theological writings, as well as his being a true follower of St. Francis, he brought the warmth and affection of Francis' love of Jesus to bear on the scholastic thought of his day. His incarnational and thus Franciscan approach was to reflect on the practical aspects of life and see how they interacted with the insights of faith.




