

PASTORAL REFLECTION



Mid-August?

It may be that one can identify with the verse in Psalm 32 that the summer's heat has dried up one's strength. While the summer's heat can sap our physical energy, how is our spiritual energy? Who/what keeps us going?

If the 14th of August were not a Sunday, this day would be the feast of St. Maximilian Kolbe, OFM Conventual. He is a favorite saint of mine. He helps nourish me spiritually. How and why?

- He was a Franciscan; born and reared in Poland (1894-1941).
- He had a great devotion to Our Blessed Mother.
- He was a pastor to the people
- St. Maximilian Kolbe exemplified love and care for those in need
- He gave his life in Auschwitz to a fellow prisoner who was a husband and a father.
- Sister Death embraced him on August 14, 1941. He died from starvation.

My appreciation for him was stirred and maintained by a priest who was in residence in a parish I attended in Dallas, TX. The priest in residence was in the same cell block as St. Maximilian. While he would rarely speak of his own imprisonment or of his association with St. Maximilian, he helped me gain a sense that the saints were (are) real people. He helped me realize the courage, respect, and love it takes to lay down one's life for another.

Who are the saints, living or deceased, that we know or have encountered?

Monday, August 15 Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary Mass at 8 am

This solemnity celebrates that Mary, the Blessed Mother of Jesus, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory. By contemplating this, we grasp that the earth is not our definitive homeland either, and that if we fix our gaze on eternal goods we, too, will one day share in this same glory. We must not lose our serenity and peace even amid the thousands of daily difficulties. Images of Our Lady taken up into Heaven shine out even more brightly when sad shadows of suffering and violence surround us. Supported by this awareness, let us continue confidently on our path of Christian commitment and forge ahead in our lives under Mary's guidance.

Mass with the Anointing of the Sick Sat., Aug. 27 at 10:30 am

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.

Is anyone among you suffering? He should pray. Is anyone in good spirits? He should sing praise. Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. (Ja 5:13-20)

Gospel Reflection for Parents




