On Tuesday, August 2, we are celebrating our Franciscan community's patronal feast day, the Feast of Our Lady of the Angels of the Portiuncula. The name Portiuncula means little portion, and this was a gift of

a small piece of property and a dilapidated church from the Benedictine monks given to St. Francis of Assisi.

After hearing the words spoken to him from an icon of Christ crucified, that said, "Go and repair My house which, as you can see, is falling into ruin," St. Francis took this literally and started repairing dilapidated churches. One of them was the Portiuncula, the little Church of Our Lady of the Angels. It was at the Portiuncula where St. Francis began to understand that God was calling him with a community of brothers to rebuild the Church by going back to following the Gospel life with Jesus as the example of serving the poor and the marginalized.

Like St. Francis, we have the opportunity of rebuilding the Church as well. We can rebuild our Church by reconciling ourselves with God and one another. We can rebuild by allowing God's healing transformation in our life. We can rebuild by using our God-given gifts in serving our brothers and sisters in need. On our patronal feast day, we are celebrating that we have been given the gift of rebuilding the Church by the witness of our life in Christ and making known the presence of God in our world.



#### **Gospel Reflection for Parents**

In the Gospel this week, we hear the parable known as the "Rich Fool." The Jewish people had long held the requirement to share their excess with those in need, acknowledging that everything belongs to God. In the early Christian Church, members shared their wealth so everyone's needs could be met. A major underlying theme of the Gospel of Luke is the right use of wealth and money. The underlying issue behind today's Gospel is greed, and Jesus teaches a lesson about the futility of a life spent amassing material possessions. The goods of the earth are essential to our survival, but they do not satisfy the deepest longings of the human spirit. As parents, it is important to stress to our children that wealth in and of itself is not seen as

wrong. Instead, amassing wealth and the underlying issue of greed in this story is where we can bring the focus to our children. Possessions do not last; at death, they are passed on to another without knowing how they will be used. Jesus has established a new situation where people are more interested in the kingdom of God and using our time here in this life to prepare for that. In our commitment to Christ, we discover that we can transform what is transitory in life by giving it away in love. We often hear stories of the rich and famous being desperately unhappy despite their abundant wealth. Material comfort cannot protect us against suffering, and many people in the poorest circumstances can be happier than those who live in affluence and comfort. The questions raised in today's readings focus on our priorities—where do we find our true fulfillment, and to what do we commit ourselves? Consider sharing with your child an example of a time you experienced great happiness that didn't involve money or possessions. How important is the acquisition of material possessions to you? Sometimes the drive to material security can distract us from what is truly important. As a family, consider finding an avenue to share some of your possessions and wealth with those in need. 
