PASTORAL REFLECTION



"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not perish but may have eternal life. God did not send His Son into the world, to condemn into the world, but in order that the world might be saved through Him." John 3: 16:17

Most of us have seen John 3:16 plastered in the stands at football games, seen it on T-shirts or coffee mugs, and used just about everywhere as a neat summation of the entire Christian Gospel. However, we can't understand Jn. 3:16 without looking at the next line of the Scripture, Jn. 3:17, which states that Christ came into the world NOT to condemn it, but to save it.

God loves *all* of Creation. God's Light shines in the darkness for *all* people.

God so loved the world that He sent Jesus, God's Son, who taught us that love is not just for those who look and act and think like we do, but also for those who are different from us. God even extends His Love to our enemies and to those who may persecute us.

God's Love is further extended to the young and old, to rich and poor, to those whose very existence is troubling, to the physically and mentally ill and the lame, the blind, the leapers and the powerless. No one is left out.

Even today when some would try to limit God's love by excluding others because of their immigration status, their sexuality, their gender, their race, their wealth or political connections, or the language they speak, we are called as God's Church to say otherwise.

We are called to be witnesses that "God so loved the world" ... and that no one is left out.

The Easter Season – Fifty Days

The Fifty Days of Easter make up what is called the *Period of Mystagogy* for the newly baptized and initiated — as well as for the entire community. *Mystagogy* means "savoring the mysteries." The Easter season is a time for all of us to deepen our grasp of the paschal mystery through sharing in the Eucharist, meditating on the Easter Scriptures, and sharing in works of charity.

We extend the baptismal themes from Easter Sunday throughout the Fifty Days by including the Sprinkling Rite at each Sunday Mass.

We hear how the disciples encounter the Risen Christ at different times and in different ways, all the while trying to understand the meaning of the Resurrection. We too contemplate the implications of the Resurrection and consider how we see the Risen Lord in our lives.

The Fifty Days have a kind of "shape" formed by the Sunday readings: The 2nd and 3rd Sundays offer encounters with the risen Christ. The 4th always brings us into the arms of the Good Shepherd. The Gospels of the 5th and 6th Sundays are drawn from Jesus' "farewell discourse" in John's Gospel, and often the subject is Christian love. In these passages, as in other places in John's Gospel, Jesus identifies himself with the divine title "I am," followed by another title — such as "the way, the truth, and the life" and "the vine."

It is very helpful for us to gather together each Sunday as Church, where we can seek the presence of Christ as we worship: we will find him in the assembly around us, in the ministers, in the Word of God, and in the Eucharist. Let us pray that we may better discern the Lord in our midst.



The Rite of Blessing and Sprinkling

With Easter joy, let us be one with the newly baptized, remembering our own immersion into Christ's saving death and resurrection. Let us give praise and thanks for the gift of water.

On the Sundays of the Easter season, the Rite of Blessing and Sprinkling of Holy Water fittingly takes place at the start of Mass as a reminder of Baptism. Since Baptism is the beginning of our participation in the risen life of Christ, it is especially appropriate to celebrate on the Sundays of the Easter season, when we especially celebrate the day of the week Christ rose from the dead.

An aspergillum is the liturgical implement used to sprinkle holy water. It can be a brush, a branch, or a perforated ball at the end of a short handle. The aspergillum is used at funerals, when the priest will sprinkle holy water on the casket. It can be used during a blessing, such as for the candles during Candlemas, the ashes for Ash Wednesday, and the palms during Palm Sunday Mass. The name derives from the Latin verb aspergere "to sprinkle."
