


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PASTORAL REFLECTION



It is not a surprise that the readings for this 5th Sunday of Lent address the reality of life and death. The life-giving death and resurrection of Jesus is rapidly approaching...The Paschal Mystery.

Ezekiel (37: 12-14) is a prophet

of hope. He is speaking to a people who are spiritually dead. In his prophecy, he speaks over 25 times the reassurance that the people shall know that God is their God. As their God, He will put His spirit in them so that they may live.

The magnificent story (according to St. John 11: 1-45) of Lazarus being raised from the dead is an overall sign that Jesus is the giver of life.

As we approach the Easter mysteries, how have you and I experienced the hope of which Ezekiel is prophesying? When have we been dead in our spirit and the grace, compassion, mercy, forgiveness, and love of God opened our eyes, ears, and hearts? Who in our family or friends have been instrumental in the resurrection of our lives? When this has occurred, is it not life giving? We have been raised up.

Mary and Martha are sad at the death of their brother. Jesus comes to their home. He calls Lazarus forth: Come out! Lazarus came out of the tomb tied with burial bands. Jesus says: "Untie him and let him go". From what do we need to untie ourselves or others? How do we need to let ourselves or others go?

Jesus tells the sisters: "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me even if they die, will live; and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die."

Striking our chest during the Confiteor

The striking of our chest is an ancient symbol of sorrow and contrition. Remember the parable of the self-righteous Pharisee who is obsessed with his own virtue, in contrast with the humble tax collector who stood at a distance, striking his own chest, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!"" (Luke 18:10-13) In striking our chests, we acknowledge — with sincere humility — the reality of our sin. Humility in this sense is not about selfhatred but rather about getting in touch with reality. We aren't examining casual, inconsequential blunders. But rather, failing to love God with all of our heart, soul, mind, and strength. Neglecting to do our duty, doing something (or doing nothing) that ultimately hurts others, ourselves, and God's honor is indeed grievous. St. Jerome said that the reason we strike our chest (rather than any other body part) is because the heart is the seat of all desires and it is the desire to do our own will that separates us most from the will of God.

"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me." (Psalm 51)
