#### PASTORAL REFLECTION



In Franciscan spirituality, one of the first things we are taught in ministry is to welcome the Spirit through divine interruption.

It has been my experience that some of the most grace-filled moments in my life have come in the form of

distraction and interruption. I think that God does this as a way of reminding us to get out of our own heads, observe our surroundings, and engage with our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Divine interruption is something that Jesus was very familiar with. Most of the stories in the Gospels take place while Jesus is "on his way" to something. Today's Gospel is no different.

The Gospel states that Jesus was "passing by" when he noticed the man born blind from birth. I imagine what halted Jesus and moved him to interact with this man was compassion — but from that compassion came one of our greatest examples of love and grace that the Gospels offer. Jesus not only drastically changed this man's life for the better by gifting him with sight, but he gifted those who witnessed the miracle with a profound example of God's love and mercy. The Gospel tells us that what this man experienced that day set him on a lifelong and ongoing path of faith formation and conversion.

As we are Christ to one another, and through divine interruption, we are often motivated first by compassion when we seek to help others — but the gifts of the Spirit go far beyond our own awareness.

On the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent, the Church celebrates the Scrutiny Rites with our Elect (those to be baptized). These "exorcism" prayers ask God to strengthen the elect and protect them

from all temptation and deceit. We may have read novels and seen movies in which the main character is an "exorcist" who confronts raspy-voiced demons possessing the bodies of innocent people. None of this happens in the ritual scrutinies. It is not a prayer that is intended to cast out demons. Instead, it's a prayer that the elect may turn away from evil and sin.
