Dear Friends, HAPPY EASTER!

We have completed the beauty of Holy Week. The liturgies have invited us to remember and celebrate Passion Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. How blessed we are!

On this Easter Sunday, the reality, the glory, the promise, and the assurance of eternal life after earthly death is our gift. The Collect (Opening Prayer) for today has us pray: O God, who on this day, through your Only Begotten Son, have conquered death and unlocked for us the path to eternity, grant, that we who keep the Solemnity of the Lord's Resurrection may through the renewal brought by your Spirit, rise up in the light of life.

Death has been conquered. The path to eternity has been unlocked for us. Our lives are renewed by the Holy Spirit. How blessed we are!

In this Jubilee Year of Hope, we are encouraged to refocus our attention and energy on being a people of Hope. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has invited us to be signs of hope and to look for signs of hope in our broken and fragile world.

Franciscan Centenary



In recent years, Franciscans have significant commemorating several 800th anniversaries in the life of Saint Francis of Assisi. This series of celebrations, known as the "Franciscan Centenary," began in 2023 with the marking of the Franciscan Rule of Life and the first Christmas at Greccio, where Saint Francis created the first living nativity scene. Next, the 800th anniversary of Saint Francis receiving the stigmata was observed. This year (2025), attention is focused on the 800th anniversary of St. Francis' beloved poem, the "Canticle of the Creatures." In 2026, the centenary will culminate with the anniversary of Saint Francis' death.

St. Francis wrote the "Canticle of the Creatures" when he was almost blind, but with faith and gratitude, he experienced the beauty of creation and recognized the Creator behind it. To Francis, all creatures were brothers and sisters, created by the same God. As we celebrate the 800th anniversary of this poem, we can be reminded to shift from using creation for our own gain to caring for it as a shared home. This is an ecological challenge and personal one, as caring for the earth also requires us to care for our hearts. The Canticle calls us to live in harmony, as Francis did, and to practice forgiveness and love, which can lead to healing both for the world and ourselves.

The Holocaust Day of Remembrance

Eighty years have passed since the Holocaust — or what our Jewish brothers and sisters call the Shoah — came to an end. As the survivors and eyewitnesses have aged and passed on, it is more important than ever that younger generations remember the horrors of the past to help prevent them from happening again. Between 1941 and 1944, more than six million Jews were killed. But it was not only the Jewish people who suffered. Millions of other so-called "undesirables" were also victims, including Christians, homosexuals, Romani people and other ethnic minorities, as well as individuals with physical disabilities. In solidarity, we invite you to observe Yom HaShoah, the Holocaust Day of Remembrance, which this year begins at sundown on Wed. April 23, and ends at nightfall on Thu. April 24. You may wish to light a candle in

your home and offer the following prayer.


Thank you for sharing in our mission to unite people of all faiths in common prayer. May God grant you peace and good.


