

PASTORAL REFLECTION



When I was young, the movie "Ben Hur" was shown every Easter. It's about Judah Ben-Hur, who, lives at the time of Christ. I always got weepy over the unjust imprisonment of Judah's mother and sister who contracted leprosy and lived as outcasts. While the disease seemed

scary, being outcast left a lasting impression on my 11-year-old heart. It was not until I visited India, 35 years later, that I learned what outcast truly means: isolation, shame, fear, unworthiness.

In today's Gospel, the leper dares to do the forbidden and approach Jesus, asking for healing. And in turn we see a simple compassionate, defiant act of Jesus who chooses to touch and to heal.

This Gospel story asks much of us. Who do we resist standing near and judge as untouchable? Perhaps our elders that are isolated, living alone? Those in the grocery store using food stamps, or the undocumented migrants who enter into this country? And I wonder: is it as much about not judging others as acknowledging our own wounds? How am I the leper? Am I brave enough to seek out healing? And does compassion allow me to overcome bias and overlook the flaws of others, to get involved and even act on their behalf?

In the movie, Judah's life crosses that of Jesus, and it ends when Ben-Hur's family is miraculously cured upon Jesus' crucifixion. I believe the "cure" begins before the actual miracle. It lies in the way Judah embraces (touches) his family, seeks out and trusts in the healer Jesus, and makes the choice to let go of resentment, judgment, and fear. A choice from which hearts are opened and lives restored.


Lenten observances focus on three areas: **prayer**, **fasting** and **almsgiving**. Consider how these practices can support and enrich each other by connecting this three-fold Lenten challenge:

Prayer — Attending daily Mass during the week, praying the Rosary, joining in "Taize Prayer Around the Cross," or walking the Stations of the Cross on Fridays. Spiritual studies are also recommended in this season.

Almsgiving — Works of personal charity, teaching someone to read or reading to others, helping at a soup kitchen, visiting or calling those who are sick or homebound, giving young parents a break by baby-sitting, helping a neighbor with a task, financially supporting a charity, or participating in the Casa's Almsgiving Envelope program.

Fasting and abstinence — Abstaining from eating meat or other foods is an act of self-discipline. Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Fasting is when a person eats less or smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. We fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. (Fasting is obligatory from age 19 until age 59.)

Putting it together — Perhaps the money saved from eating lighter meals can be shared with the poor. Or maybe the time spent preparing and eating an elaborate meal can instead be spent in prayer or service to others. Combining prayer and almsgiving with fasting and/or abstaining can bring more meaning and purpose to your Lenten practice. Let us all pray for the grace and integrity and strength to "keep Lent" faithfully.

Mass with the Anointing of the Sick Saturday, February 10 at 10:30 am

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.

Is anyone among you suffering? He should pray. Is anyone in good spirits? He should sing praise. Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. (Ja 5:13-20)

FRC Receives Grant for Rose Court Renovations and Mental Health Ministry

The Franciscan Renewal Center recently received a generous grant from the Diane & Bruce Halle Foundation to support the Mental Health Ministry Initiative for five years and Historic Rose Court Renovations.

The center's Therapy, Support, and Counseling Ministry offers donation-based professional behavioral health therapy to help individuals, couples, and families cope with life's challenges — such as relationship issues, stress, depression/anxiety, and personal growth. The ministry also provides associate-level licensees the opportunity to receive clinical supervision hours needed to complete their degree. Historic Rose Court renovations are expected to begin June/July 2024 and include refurbishing its 10 lodging rooms, landscaping, and roadways. Upon completion, all 86 lodging rooms on the 25-acre campus will have been remodeled.

"We are very grateful for the Diane and Bruce Halle Foundation and their longstanding support for our service to the community," said Charles Brown, Executive Director of the Franciscan Renewal Center. "This grant will allow us to continue providing professional therapy for people in need. In the ministry's 50-year history, no one has been turned anyone away due to lack of funds. The improvements to Historic Rose Court will provide guests with the serene, comfortable environment they expect for their stay."
