

PASTORAL REFLECTION



Today's Gospel reading reminds me of a song from the folk-music era of my childhood: "They'll Know We Are Christians by Our Love." Written in 1966 by Fr. Peter Scholtes, a Catholic priest in Chicago, the song is based on John 13:35 — "By this everyone will

know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

Originally composed for a youth gathering, the song quickly became an anthem of Christian unity and social justice, especially during the civil rights movement. Its message of love crossed denominational lines, making it a favorite in ecumenical and interfaith gatherings. (We sang it a lot in those days, with my sister accompanying us on guitar at the "Folk Mass.")

The song calls Christians to embody Jesus' example of sacrificial love—not to claim moral superiority, but to serve as a witness to the Gospel. Authentic Christian love is not inward-looking; it must be shared with all, following Christ's command to love our neighbors—and even our enemies.

At its core, this is what our faith is about. Jesus didn't say we'd be known by our words or status, but by our love. And so, love must remain the defining mark—and goal—of every Christian.

The Council of Nicaea 1700 years later...

This week, the Church marks the 1700th anniversary of the First Council of Nicaea, which began on May 20, 325 AD. This was a foundational moment in Christian history. Nicaea is a city located in northwestern Turkey (its modern-day name is İznik) and was an important city in the Roman and Byzantine Empires.

The council was convened by Emperor Constantine in response to a growing theological crisis of the time. He brought together bishops from across the Christian world to address divisions threatening the unity of the faith—most notably the "Arian controversy." Arius, a priest from Alexandria, taught that Jesus Christ was *created* by the Father and therefore he was not fully divine. This teaching threatened the heart of Christian faith: if Christ were not truly God, how could He save?

The council met for about two months, and —guided by the Holy Spirit—firmly rejected this teaching and proclaimed that the Son is "begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father." Consubstantial is an imporant word that means "of the same substance or essence." Jesus is of the same divine essence or being as God the Father — he is fully and truly God, not a lesser or created being.

From this historic gathering at Nicaea emerged the Nicene Creed, a profound affirmation of Christian belief that continues to unite diverse denominations. Those words have shaped worship, theology, and identity for centuries. This anniversary is not just a commemoration of the past, but a call to unity today. In an age marked by division, the spirit of Nicaea urges Christians to seek truth together, guided by love and a shared confession of faith in Christ.

May this milestone inspire reflection, renewal, and a deeper communion among all who profess the name of Jesus, the one in whom the fullness of God dwells.

Why Two Creeds?

You may notice that the Catholic Mass sometimes uses the Apostles' Creed and other times the Nicene Creed—and occasionally, a Renewal of Baptismal Promises. Why the variation?

The Apostles' Creed is the older and shorter of the two, rooted in the early Church as a simple summary of faith. It's often chosen during Lent, Easter, or in liturgies when children might be present or when catechesis is emphasized because of its clarity and simplicity.

The Nicene Creed, developed at the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD, is longer and more detailed. It was written to defend the full divinity of Jesus and the Holy Spirit at a time of great controversy.

Both creeds affirm the same core truths of the Christian faith, expressed in different ways from different moments in the Church's history. And to add a bit more richness: on certain feast days, like the Easter Vigil, Easter Sunday, and on baptismal feast days, the Renewal of Baptismal Promises may be used instead of a Creed—reminding us of our identity as baptized members of Christ's Body.

Celebrating 10 Years of Laudato Si'



Sunday – Response to the Cry of The Earth:

Consider how you can conserve water and energy in your home.



Support local charity programs by contributing your time, talent, or treasures to food banks and shelters.

Tuesday – Ecological Economics:

Consider where you shop and the products you purchase. Are they contributing to a healthy planet?

Wednesday – Adoption of Simple Lifestyle:

Cut down or eliminate single-use plastics and foam-based containers. Reduce food waste and meat-based meals.

Thursday – Ecological Education:

Attend an ecological program at the Casa. Attend the Laudato Si' Celebration on May 22. Registration closes Monday, May 19.

Friday - Ecological Spirituality:

Find a place in nature today to quiet the mind and connect to the spirit within. One suggestion is *Contemplation in the Desert* on Mondays at the Casa.

Saturday – Emphasis on Community Involvement:

Research and serve with an organization that is focused on your interest and begin volunteering.


