Dear Holy People of God,
 In this Sunday's Gospel reading, there is a small but significant detail that we might easily overlook: Moses and Elijah converse with Jesus about "His exodus."

The word "exodus" immediately brings to mind Moses, the great leader who, by God's power, led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt to the Promised Land. But Moses' exodus was only a foreshadowing of a far greater deliverance—the one that Jesus would accomplish in Jerusalem.

Like Moses, Jesus came to lead God's people on a journey to freedom. But while Moses freed the Israelites from physical slavery, Jesus frees us from the slavery of sin. Moses led the people through the waters of the Red Sea; Jesus leads us through the waters of baptism. Moses brought the Law; Jesus fulfills it. Moses interceded for the people before God; Jesus is the eternal Mediator, offering His very life for our salvation.

Lent invites us to follow Jesus in this new exodus—a journey from sin to grace, from death to life. Just as the Israelites had to trust in God while walking through the wilderness, we too must trust in Christ as He leads us through the trials and sacrifices of this season.

As we journey through this Lent, let us ask ourselves: Are we willing to follow Christ in His exodus? What do we need to leave behind to embrace the freedom He offers? We must remember that beyond the suffering of the cross lies the victory of the resurrection.

Striking our chest during the Confiteor

The act of striking our chest is an ancient yet profound symbol of sorrow and contrition, rooted in the humble recognition of our imperfections. It calls to mind the parable of the humble tax collector (Luke 18:10), who, standing at a distance, struck his chest in prayer, saying, "God, be merciful to me a sinner." This gesture invites us to acknowledge, with deep humility, the reality of our failings—not in self-condemnation, but in a true awareness of how we fall short of loving God and others. It is the desire to follow our own will, rather than God's will, that distances us from Him.

St. Jerome said that we strike our chest because the heart, the source of our desires, is where we most need God's mercy. "Create in me a clean heart, O God" (Ps. 51), and help us to live in true humility, seeking always to align our will with God's.

COMMUNITY CONNECTION



Immersion Trip through the Lens of the Provincial Priorities (Part Two)

In January, Franciscans held a national provincial synod and composed eight priorities. In January, I attended an Immersion Experience at the San Solano Missions in Topawa, AZ. I saw several of the priorities at

work, including:

Priority 3: We commit ourselves to listening to and accompanying young adults.

- **Welcome, protect, and accompany migrants.**

While I was at San Solano, a young man knocked on the door asking for food. They gave him a sandwich and blanket. Father James shared how he provided a meal to a migrant teenager and offered the church as a sanctuary for the night.

- **...support young adults in our ministries...**

A Topawa volunteer instructor encourages the teens as leaders for younger kids in formation classes. As the friars distribute Communion across the reservation, they bless many young adults who don't

take Communion.

- **Each fraternity must respond to local poor.**

San Solano serves the Tohono O'odham. Nearly 66% of residents live below the poverty line. Friars provide guidance in faith, regular Mass, and culturally important funerals and memorials (often hours away).

- **Foster racial and cultural inclusion.**

The friars integrate the local culture beautifully, including an Our Lady of Guadalupe shrine, and church art reflecting the locals.

- **Support...volunteer ministries across the province.**

Several of the (faith formation) volunteers, with the friars' support, generously discussed their faith and struggles.
