#### PASTORAL REFLECTION



This weekend, during the Christmas Season, we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. The word Epiphany means the appearance, the manifestation, to show.

Matthew (2:1-12) provides the story of the magi arriving in Bethlehem. They discover

newborn King, fall prostrate, and do the homage. After offering Him Him their they return home by another gifts, way. The lives of the magi were changed.

The Child of Bethlehem has been born in time. The Word has become flesh. The gift of the Incarnation is His gift to us. As we encounter the Son of God and the Son of Mary, how do we go about our lives differently? Are we changed? Do we see ourselves in the Light of the Incarnation? Do we believe, accept, and act like those over whom His glory shines? How do we manifest kindness, patience, compassion, forgiveness, and mercy? Not only with ourselves but with others?

The Epiphany invites us all year long to manifest God's love and care. In the Eucharistic Prayers (3 and 4) for Various Needs, these words might provide us with guidance and encouragement.

From Prayer 3: Grant that all the faithful of the Church, looking into the signs of the times by the light of faith, may constantly devote themselves to the service of the Gospel. Keep us attentive to the needs of all that, sharing their grief and pain, their joy and hope, we may faithfully bring them the good news of salvation and go forward with them along the way of the Kingdom.

From Prayer 4: Open our eyes to the needs of our brothers and sisters; inspire us in words and actions to comfort those who labor and are burdened. Make us serve them truly, after the example of Christ and at His command. May your Church stand as a living witness to truth, freedom, peace, and justice so that all people may be raised up to a new hope.

Let's open our hearts and eyes... Let's go home by another way.

# Holy families ... for anyone facing hardships ...

The Gospel stories about the Holy Family give us wonderful examples to follow, particularly in times of personal challenge. From the beginning, Mary and Joseph had their share of difficulties. They were unsettled by the news of her pregnancy, and in the days before Jesus' birth, they had to take an arduous journey to Bethlehem. Without proper accommodations, Mary had to give birth in very inconvenient circumstances. Instead of returning home, they had to escape at night to a foreign land to keep the baby safe, having to proceed carefully for fear of the new king.

Yet at every step, God watched over them, and they kept faith.

May we also know that same consolation and keep the faith in our own challenging times.



# Epiphany

Today we recall the magi, who, drawn by the star, journeyed from distant lands to find the newborn king and present him with their finest gifts. We each make our own journey to the Lord, and we offer our finest gifts — our prayers, our lives, our future. And we walk alongside others who are on their own journeys, too.

When Isaiah wrote the poem that we hear today, the Israelites had just returned from decades of exile. Judah was devastated and left desolate, but Isaiah saw it through eyes of faith:

Arise! Shine, for your light has come, the glory of the Lord has dawned upon you. Though darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds, the peoples, upon you the Lord will dawn, and over you his glory will be seen.

Light is an invaluable resource for those on a long journey. For millennia, the stars enabled travelers to navigate at night and light from the moon enabled them to see their way. When the Israelites' long exile ended, Isaiah pointed to Jerusalem as a beacon, shining radiantly to draw families, rulers, and foreigners to its glory, even as it was still rebuilding after years of desolation.

So too the star above nearby Bethlehem drew the magi, though it was to a humble stable, inhabited by a family that to Herod would have looked absolutely unremarkable.

We may feel that we have nothing radiant in us or in our lives, but with the light of Christ in us we are in fact blessed with a source of light for ourselves and others.


