PASTORAL REFLECTION



How has the Lord used your greatest mistakes as sources of renewal?

Perhaps you can find yourself relating to my experience; the things within myself that I dreaded, bungled, or trapped in vats of anxiety became the things I focused on incessantly.

For stretches of years, that focus was pejorative and stifling, because all I did was examine the flaws and scrutinize without movement. However, through a long campaign of attempting to adjust my interior life, I felt the veil over my eyes lift, and I came to a stunning, gorgeous realization:

God gave me all the tools I needed to be better, and I hadn't seen them for what they were. Flipping that switch, I found myself understanding how I had grown in all the areas that were once perceived weaknesses. I had built the muscles required to effect change without knowing, and it became clear that it was my responsibility to use this experience to help others.

This week's Gospel is the perfect example of how we, people of a broken Church, have been chosen by God to mold the world. The Lord forgave Peter in parallel to his sin, as we are all forgiven in accordance with our errors. Then, Jesus gave Peter an effective penance that He also gives us: to lead the Lord's people into the fullness of redemption.

On this Third Sunday of Easter, in celebration of new life through Christ, let us also celebrate how our failures can strengthen us in the Spirit.

The Fifty Days of Easter: A Time to Savor the Mystery

Easter isn't just one day — it's a whole season! That is, a 50-day celebration that invites us to go deeper into the joy and meaning of the Resurrection. This time is called the *Period of Mystagogy*, which means "savoring the mysteries," and is especially meaningful for those newly baptized but also a gift for all of us. During these weeks, we are to reflect more deeply on how we encounter the Risen Christ — not only as we gather each Sunday in Scripture and in the Eucharist, but in our everyday lives. In the Sunday readings, we hear how Jesus appears in surprising and tender ways, and we're invited to ask: *Where do I see the Risen Lord in my own life*?

Are there moments where your faith becomes real not just ideas, but encounters with the "living Christ," perhaps in times of vulnerability, courage, or grace... sacred moments of human connection.

We can experience Christ present in the healing of broken relationships and the restoration of peace. Whether we are reconciling with someone else, or experiencing the grace of being forgiven by them.

We might feel Christ's own compassion in those quiet, tender spaces. At the side of someone who is suffering; when we accompany someone in doubt... or illness, or the final moments of life.

Christ is alive in the love we extend to one another; walking with someone through sorrow or struggle; comforting a friend who is troubled or grieving, supporting someone through addiction, or simply being a nonjudgmental listener.

Let's pray for open hearts, so we can recognize Christ in our midst and grow in the joy of the Resurrection.
